VII. Agenda Items

1. Consider an Ordinance by the City Council for the City of Forest Park, Georgia, to amend the 2016-2017 Operating Budget to appropriate additional funds to cover salaries and related payroll tax costs for Emergency Management Services Department; to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; to provide an effective date; and for other purposes.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY: Salaries and related payroll costs were not budgeted for the Fire Emergency Management Services Department, for the current fiscal year. This is due to the elimination of the two positions in the Department, beginning with the current year. Final payroll costs for the positions were incurred during the beginning of the current year. So, budget amounts need to be appropriated to cover these costs that were not anticipated. The total amount needed is \$18,204.

2. Consider an Ordinance by the City Council for the City of Forest Park, Georgia, to amend the 2016-2017 Operating Budget to appropriate additional funds to cover unexpected costs for several departments; to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; to provide an effective date; and for other purposes.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY: The budget amounts for line items in several departments are needed to be amended to cover costs incurred and not anticipated in the original budget. The line item names, amounts and reasons for amendment are included in Exhibit A attached to the proposed Ordinance.

3. Consider a request by Rep. Valencia Stovall to host the 5th Annual Career-Job Fair, to be held Thursday, September 21, 2017, at the Forest Park Gymnasium.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY: The office of State Representative Valencia Stovall will host the 5th Annual Career-Job Fair on Thursday, September 21, 2017 at 1pm-4pm. It is our request to the City of Forest Park to utilize the Forest Park Gymnasium for this event. This past year was the first time the career job fair was held at the Forest Park Gymnasium. It was well received with 40 exhibitors/organizations and over 200 people throughout the duration of the fair.

The time request will be 11am-6pm to account for setup and closeout. The actual time is career-job fair is 1pm-4pm. Equipment needed will be tables, chairs and access to electricity. Our annual collaborative partners include the Georgia Department of Labor and Ambitious Initiatives.

4. Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with DAF to pour a concrete walkway and patio for the Police Department Firing Range at Gillem Logistic Center.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND: This is concrete work needed to construct the Police Department Firing Range located within the Gillem Logistic Complex. The work entails forming and pouring concrete walkways for the firing range and a twelve foot concrete slab/patio along the side and front of the building. The contractor is responsible for setting the proper grade, forming and shaping the areas as needed to establish proper drainage. The bids were submitted based on a plan provided by the Police Department.

5. Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with _____ for a Sixteen (16) Police Firing Range Automated Target System.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND: The proposed new Resolution will authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the selected bidder, in accordance with Title 3 of Forest Park Code of Ordinances, for a target police firing range target system. This target system will allow police officers to enhance their proficiency in the use of firearms and qualify under Georgia State guidelines which require the use of turning targets. This contractual agreement will authorize the selected company to construct and install said target system.

6. Consider a Resolution by the City Council of the City of Forest Park authorizing the use of E911 funding to upgrade the existing 911 phone system.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND: The current 911 phone system was installed in 2006 and has become antiquated due to changes in technology. In comparison, Next Generation 911 systems not only receive voice communication but are capable of receiving photos, videos, and text messages. In 2012, the City of Forest Park and Motorola Solutions entered into a Municipal Lease – Purchase Agreement for the acquisition of a new public safety radio system. The terms of this agreement allow the City of Forest Park to make yearly payments until the system is paid in full, in 2019. Motorola Solutions now holds a current state contract (980-280008) for a Next Generation 911 system and has agreed to roll the existing agreement into a new Municipal Lease – Purchase Agreement. The new agreement would allow the City of Forest Park to purchase the new Next Generation 911 system, while the payment amount remains the same. The new agreement would increase the payment terms by four years and allow the City of Forest Park to save an additional \$10,304.52 per year in system maintenance. As with the current agreement, all required payments would be made using funds collected for E911 purposes.

7. Consider a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Forest Park amending provisions of the personnel rules and regulations.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY: Governor Nathan Deal signed into law May 8, 2017, to take effect July 1, 2017, for employers with twenty-five (25) or more employees in Georgia that offer paid sick leave will be required to permit their employees to use (5) five sick leave days to care for their immediate family.

Comment Period: Dianne Lunsford, 5585 Skyland Drive, discussed the lack of participation at the Forest Park north side clean-up. Ms. Lunsford commended the Public Works employees for their hard work in participating in the clean-up. Ms. Lunsford discussed charging a small fee per participant for the new recreational vision at Gillem.

Dr. Leon Beeler, 1000 Main St., discussed the good job that was done at the Forest Park north side clean-up. Dr. Beeler suggested providing a city survey asking the residents of Forest Park what they would like to see in the City.

LaWanda Folami, 1080 Lloyd Drive, discussed the contract with Ralph McDuffie and suggested that the City needs to market it ourselves. Ms. Folami asked what the total budget amount is for the City.

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, TO AMEND THE 2016-2017 OPERATING BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO COVER SALARIES AND RELATED PAYROLL TAX COSTS FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Section 6.33 of the City Charter (“the City Charter”) for the City of Forest Park, Georgia (“the City”) provides that the City Council “shall by ordinance adopt the final operating budget” for the City for each fiscal year, and a final operating budget has been adopted for the current fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.35 of the City Charter provides that the City Council “may make changes in the appropriations contained in the current operating budget” with the limitations provided for therein; and

WHEREAS, amounts are requested to be transferred and appropriated to the Salaries and related payroll line items of the Emergency Management Services Department. The transfer and appropriation are needed to cover costs not anticipated in the original budget; and

WHEREAS, the costs in the Salaries and related payroll line items, as itemized in attached Exhibit A, will require transfer and appropriation to the operating budget in the total amount of \$18,204.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$18,204 is hereby transferred from line item number 100-22-1510-57-9000, Reserve For Contingencies in the amount of \$16,450 and appropriated from line item number 100-00-0000-13-4200, Unappropriated General Fund Balance in the amount of \$1,754 to Salaries and related payroll line items, as itemized in attached Exhibit A, in the total amount of \$18,204, for the 2016-2017 annual budget for the City of Forest Park, Georgia;

Section 2. That the changes to the ordinances set forth above shall not be included in the City of Forest Park Code of Ordinances.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which such portions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon and after its final passage.

WHEREAS, Section 6.33 of the City Charter (“the City Charter”) for the City of Forest Park, Georgia (“the City”) provides that the City Council “shall by ordinance adopt the final operating budget” for the City for each fiscal year, and a final operating budget has been adopted for the current fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.35 of the City Charter provides that the City Council “may make changes in the appropriations contained in the current operating budget” with the limitations provided for therein; and

WHEREAS, amounts are requested to be appropriated to line items of several Departments. The appropriations are needed to cover costs incurred and not anticipated in the original budget; and

WHEREAS, the costs to the line items, as itemized in attached Exhibit A, will require appropriations to the operating budget in the total amount of \$154,680.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$154,680 is hereby appropriated from line item number 100-00-0000-13-4200, Unappropriated General Fund Balance to the line items, as itemized in attached Exhibit A, in the total amount of \$154,680, for the 2016-2017 annual budget for the City of Forest Park, Georgia;

Section 2. That the changes to the ordinances set forth above shall not be included in the City of Forest Park Code of Ordinances.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which such portions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon and after its final passage.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH DAF CONCRETE TO POUR CONCRETE WALKWAY AND PATIO FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FIRING RANGE AT GILLEM LOGISTIC CENTER.

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Park solicited bids to pour concrete walkways and patio at the Police Department Firing Range at Gillem Logistics Center.

WHEREAS, Three (3) bids were received for the project, and

WHEREAS, DAF Concrete was the lowest qualified bidder on the project with a bid of \$31,650.00, and

WHEREAS, the cost of the services will be paid from 2015 SPLOST funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. Approval of Contract. The form, terms and provisions of the Contract presented to this meeting are hereby approved, and all of the terms and provisions thereof are hereby incorporated herein by this reference as if the Contract was set out in this Resolution in its entirety. The Mayor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Contract with DAF for concrete walkway and patio at the Police Department Firing Range at Gillem Logistics Center. The Contract is to be in substantially the form now before this meeting and hereby approved, or with such changes therein as may be deemed necessary by the persons executing the same, upon advice of counsel, to accomplish the purposes of the transaction contemplated therein and in this Resolution and shall not be inconsistent with or contrary to such purposes.

Section II. No Personal Liability. No stipulation, obligation or agreement herein contained or contained in the Contract shall be deemed to be a stipulation, obligation or agreement of any council member, officer, agent or employee of the City in his individual capacity, and no such officer, director, agent or employee shall be subject to personal liability or accountability by reason of the execution of the Contract.

Section III. General Authority. From and after the execution and delivery of the documents hereinabove authorized, the Mayor of the City of Forest Park, Georgia and the proper officers, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of said documents as executed and are further authorized to take any and all further actions and execute and deliver any and all other documents and certificates as may be necessary or desirable in connection with the Contract. In the event that Mayor is not available to execute the documents herein authorized, the Mayor Pro-Tem is hereby authorized to execute such documents.

Section IV. Actions Ratified, Approved and Confirmed. All acts and doings of the officers of the City which are in conformity with the purposes and intents of this Resolution and in the furtherance of the execution, delivery and performance of the Contract shall be, and the same hereby are, in all respects ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section V. Severability of Invalid Provisions. If any one or more of the agreements or provisions herein contained shall be held contrary to any express provision of law or contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited, or against public policy, or shall for any reason whatsoever be held invalid, then such covenants, agreements or provisions shall be null and void and shall be deemed separable from the remaining agreements and provisions and shall in no way affect the validity of any of the other agreements and provisions hereof.

Section VI. Repealing Clause. All resolutions or parts thereof of the City in conflict with the provisions herein contained are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and repealed.

Section VII. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

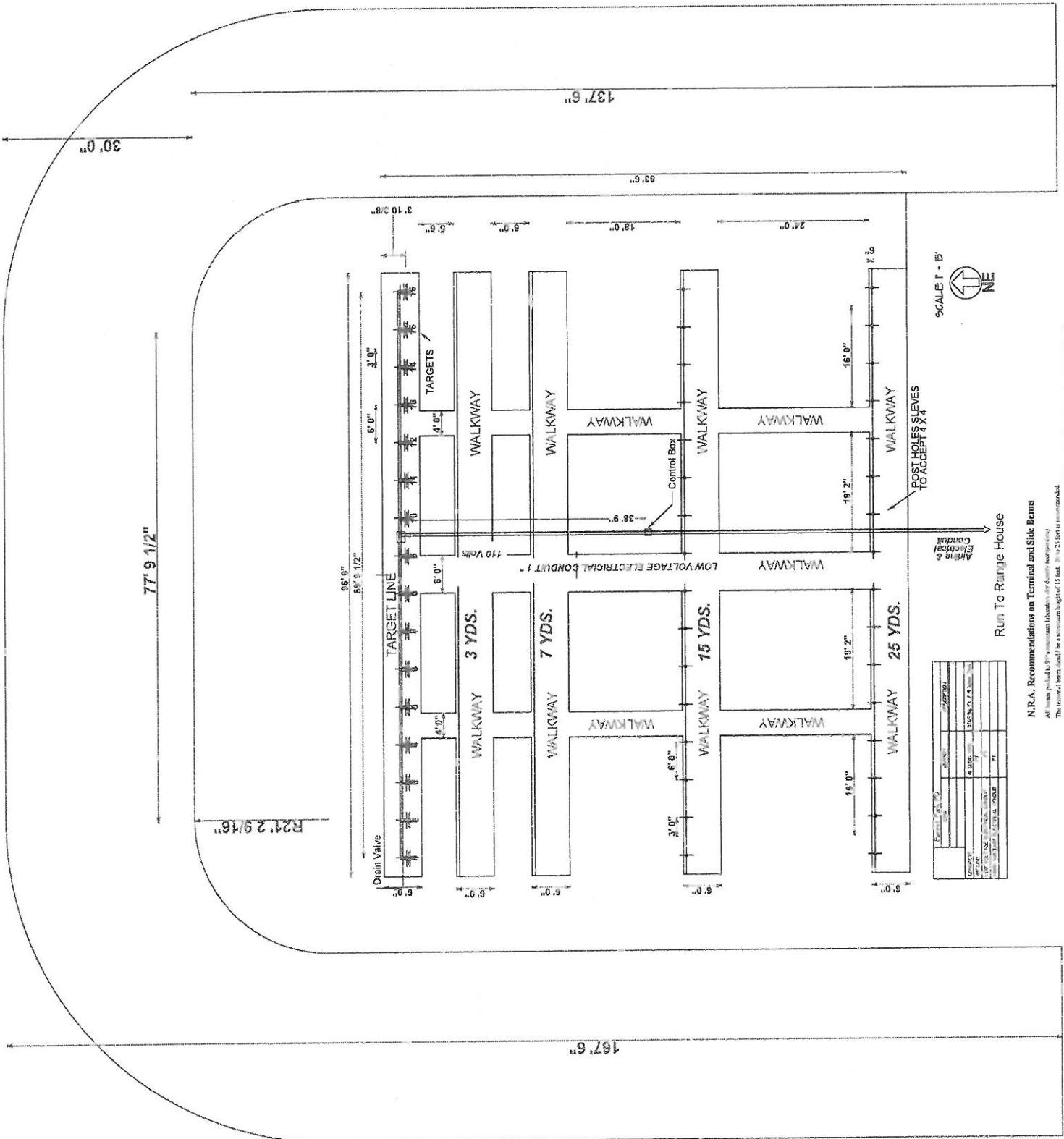

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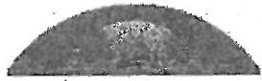

Section II. No Personal Liability. No stipulation, obligation or agreement herein contained or contained in the Contract shall be deemed to be a stipulation, obligation or agreement of any council member, officer, agent or employee of the City in his individual capacity, and no such officer, director, agent or employee shall be subject to personal liability or accountability by reason of the execution of the Contract.

WHEREAS, Motorola Solutions Next Generation 911 system will offer immediate maintenance cost savings over the existing 911 system; while not increasing the current E911 payment to Motorola Solutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council resolves that a resolution be adopted to authorize the use E911 funding in the amount of \$390,633.63 to extend the current lease-purchase agreement and upgrade the existing 911 system to Next Generation 911.

WHEREAS, on May 8, Governor Nathan Deal amend Chapter 1 of Title 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provision relative to labor and industrial relations;

WHEREAS, so as to allow employees to use up to five (5) days of earned sick leave, per calendar year for the care of an immediate family member;

WHEREAS, this change shall be repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2020, unless extended by an Act of the General Assembly

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Forest Park:

Rule IX, Section 11. That the City of Forest Park Personnel Rules are amended by as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, with added language shown as red-lined version.

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect July 1, 2017.

EXHIBIT A

SECTION 11. SICK LEAVE

a. Purpose: The City provides paid sick leave to employees to for the purpose of encouraging and enabling employees to recover from a bona fide illness or injury which prevents the employee from working, and to enable employees to obtain medical or dental care for themselves, for medical examinations. An employee may take use sick leave to attend to and recover from the effects of the death of an immediate family member, limited to up to (3) days where the decedent dies in a local area and (5) days where the decedent dies for an out of state death. Paid sick leave insures that employees will not suffer the loss of pay in order to take care of such personal needs which otherwise would interfere with their abilities to effectively perform their job duties. Sick leave is not and should not be utilized as a form of additional vacation benefits.

b. Kin-Care (1). Effective July 1, 2017, and until June 30, 2020 (unless extended by the City) "employees" as defined in O.C.G.A. §34-1-10(a)(1) who have accrued paid sick leave time may use up to five (5) days of such accrued paid sick leave per year for the purpose of caring for an immediate family member (as defined in O.C.G.A. § 34-1-10(a)(4) to care for an employee's child, spouse, grandchild, grandparent, or parent or any dependents as shown in the employee's most recent tax return. Such leave shall be designated as "kin-care leave". It shall not increase the total amount of paid sick leave to which an employee is entitled. The term 'sick leave' shall not include paid short-term or long-term disability leave.

(2) No employee shall be entitled to use more paid sick leave than the employee has accrued. Any employee who uses such "Kin-Care Leave" shall comply with the terms of the City's employer's employee sick leave policy.

(3) As a condition of taking "Kin-Care Leave" an employee may be required to provide a statement from a physician attesting to the immediate family member's need for such care, provided that no employee shall be required to identify the immediate family member's medical or health condition that necessitates the "Kin Care Leave."
